President's Message

We joined the Rotary Club of Camberwell last Wednesday for a packed program and a full house. Hearing from the Rotary Friendship Exchange, Club Presidents from District 1190 (Cumbria and Lancashire), was very interesting, especially as many of the audience have visited the beautiful Lakes District in the UK. The Camberwell Club members are currently hosting the UK Rotarians on this exchange. Doug Gillan and Cameron produced another outstanding meal for the occasion.

Susie Lachals, from Teachers Across Borders, gave us an account of the wonderful work her organisation does in Cambodia. TAB teach local Cambodian teachers to enable them to become better teachers and to in turn teach one another. This improves the education provided in many schools throughout the regions where TAB operates. The Australian teachers are volunteers and spend 5-10 days in less than favourable conditions to undertake this work. The Rotary Club of Camberwell have supported TAB for some years, so they were pleased to present Susie with a further \$1,000 towards their work in Cambodia.

President Richard Stewart described Adrian Campbell's 'Seeds of Peace' project presentation very well in the Camberwell bulletin this week. "Adrian has spent the past 2+ years working towards the successful completion of the 'Seeds of Peace' project. This initiative which involves all Boroondara clubs arose initially out of the successful Peace scholarships to Hiroshima. To commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Gallipoli landings, the clubs engaged with all secondary schools in Boroondara to encourage a dialogue on how to achieve lasting peace rather than war. Students were encouraged to submit peace essays on the topic and seven successful submissions saw the relevant students on a trip to Gallipoli where they will tour the battlefields and attend a Rotary Peace Forum. On their return they are committed to 12 months community work to promote peace in our community. Their essays, trip photos and diaries of the trip are to be placed in a book and held at the Australian War Memorial. In addition with the help of a Federal Government grant, 'Lone Pines' are being planted at all the schools with a special plaque commemorating the event. Thanks to all the Rotarians and friends who assisted with the various activities to make this a reality and special thanks to Adrian, who made this project his own and through the force of his will and his dedication brought it to fruition."
